ARTS 1301	Art Appreciation	3	09:00-11:05	Course description: The course will present an artistic and historical overview of the art and architecture of the Islamic world, stretching from North Africa to the Indus Valley, and its relation and importance to Islamic culture and traditions from the rise of Islam in the seventh century to the Mongol conquest of Baghdad in the mid-thirteenth century. The art forms of painting, manuscripts, decorative arts, and architecture (both religious and secular) will be emphasized to appreciate what came to be known as the 'Golden Age of Islam'.		✓	√	√	
ARTS 1203	The Jeddah Art Scene	2	11:30-12:50	This course introduces major works of art from around the world. It highlights painting, sculpture, and other art forms as masterpieces. It emphasizes the connection of masterpieces to Jeddah's art scenes.		✓	✓	✓	
ARTS 1201	Basic Graphic design	2	09:30- 10:50	This course is a basic introduction to graphic design for students coming from diverse disciplines. Students are introduced to basic elements and principles of graphic design as well as fundamentals in typography. They learn the use of basic letterforms, typographic contrast, visual hierarchy, some major type families and their characteristics, and basic grid systems. Students combine images, text, and graphics to create cohesive designs that can be applied to posters, presentation slides, and documents.	√	✓	√	√	
CLAN 1301	Introduction to Chinese Language	3	09:00-11:05	This course introduces Chinese language. It emphasizes listening, speaking, reading, and writing in Chinese. The course raises interest in Chinese culture and life.	✓	✓	✓	✓	✓
COML 3302	International Sale of Goods	3	14:00-16:05	This course introduces the law governing contracts of sale and international transactions. It examines the nature and function of the law of international sales and deals with the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods 1980 (CISG) and the Incoterms. With 85 countries parties to it, the CISG provides an abundance of available material (case law and jurisprudence) for this course. Focus is also cast on the duties of sellers and buyers, as well as the remedies available in cases of breach in sales contracts.				√	
COMM 1301	Communication Skills I	3	11:30-13:35	This course focuses on the development of intellectual viewpoints, class discussions and debates. The course emphasizes the writing skills needed to produce different types of essays, demonstrating key rhetorical devices and correct citations. COMM 1302	Communication Skills II	3	14:00-16:05 11:30-13:35	This course reinforces critical reading and academic texts analysis. DRAW 1201	Introduction to Drawing	2	14:00-15:20	This is an introductory class in the fundamentals of drawing. The students will be experimenting traditional and experimental method in drawing. There is a strong emphasis on foundation skills such as form, value, composition and perspective. Perceptual skills and self –expression will be stressed. ENRM 1301	Remedial English Instruction	3	14:00-16:05	This course provides solid background for the various milestones of the writing process, starting from creating and developing ideas to the development of short essays. It focuses on dealing with academic topics including conducting relevant oral presentations, summaries, paraphrases and short essays. The course also emphasizes the usage of library and online resources as well as the reflection on own and others' work.	√			✓	
ENTR 3301	Entrepreneurship and Design Thinking	3	13:40-18:10 from 11/6/2023 to 22/6/2023	This course introduces the concept of entrepreneurship, nature of enterprise and role of the entrepreneur. It emphasizes the theoretical and practical perspectives of the entrepreneurship process. FREN 1301	French Language and Culture	3	11:30-13:35	This course introduces French, idiomatic expressions, and the basic grammar structures necessary for communication in daily situations. Topics of current events and special interest will be emphasized in short classroom discussions. Emphasis is on the four main language skills: reading, writing, listening and speaking. ICTC 1301	Information and Communication Technology	3	14:00-16:50	The course introduces the basic computer knowledge and skills required in the everyday professional and personal use of computers. INTL 4201	Public International Law	2	9:00-10:20	This course introduces students to the law governing relations among states. It emphasizes the basic concepts and problems of public international law and the underlying principles of the international legal system. The course explores the sources and subjects of international law, international law and the use of force, diplomacy law, state liability and the relationship between international law and the domestic law of states. This course has a practical significance, especially for students who consider working for international organizations or the foreign ministry.				√	
INTR 3303	International Trade	3	14:00-16:05	This course introduces principles relating to international trade, such as comparative advantage, capital flows, migration, and returns to scale. It also discusses at the development of international trade policy, and the impact of the international framework on domestic laws. SHAL 4303	Principles of Islamic Jurisprudence	3	14:00-16:05	This course provides general knowledge of the meaning and function of Usul al-Fiqh in regulating the process of ijtihad. Also, it describes the origin and development of Islamic legal theory and explains the meaning of the rules of law (al-Ahkam) together with the methods of deriving them from the revealed sources.				✓

ITAI 1201	Introduction to Artificial Intelligence	2	09:00-10:20	This course focuses on the basics of Artificial Intelligence (AI). It requires no prior knowledge of computing or mathematics. It presents the concepts and techniques of AI in problem solving, using popular examples in a simple, non-mathematical and non-algorithmic approach. The course explains how an AI agent searches for a goal, how it satisfies constraints, and how simple probabilistic approaches are used to give excellent predictions in a practical method.		✓	√	✓	
VLCE 1301	Basic Printmaking	3	10:00- 13:35	This course introduces the methodologies and concepts of traditional printmaking processes and the basics of color printing. It provides an overview of the tools, methods and materials for making two-dimensional printed artworks with particular focus on how manual printing and traditional techniques relate to contemporary concepts and individual art practice.
